



Pennsylvania's Firearm Reciprocity Agreements/Recognition

Pennsylvania has formal written reciprocity agreements with a number of states that recognize a valid license to carry firearms issued by Pennsylvania. In addition to the formal agreements, other forms of reciprocity are applicable.

The information in this card is only applicable to Pennsylvania residents. Residents of other states who wish to carry a firearm in Pennsylvania should consult the website of the Pennsylvania Attorney General. Residents of other states who wish to carry a firearm in another state pursuant to a Pennsylvania license to carry a firearm should consult the appropriate law enforcement authority in the state where they wish to carry.

This information changes regularly. For the latest information, as well as provisions specific to each state concerning locations which are off-limits to firearms, contact the Office of Attorney General at **(717) 787-3391** or **www.attorneygeneral.gov**.

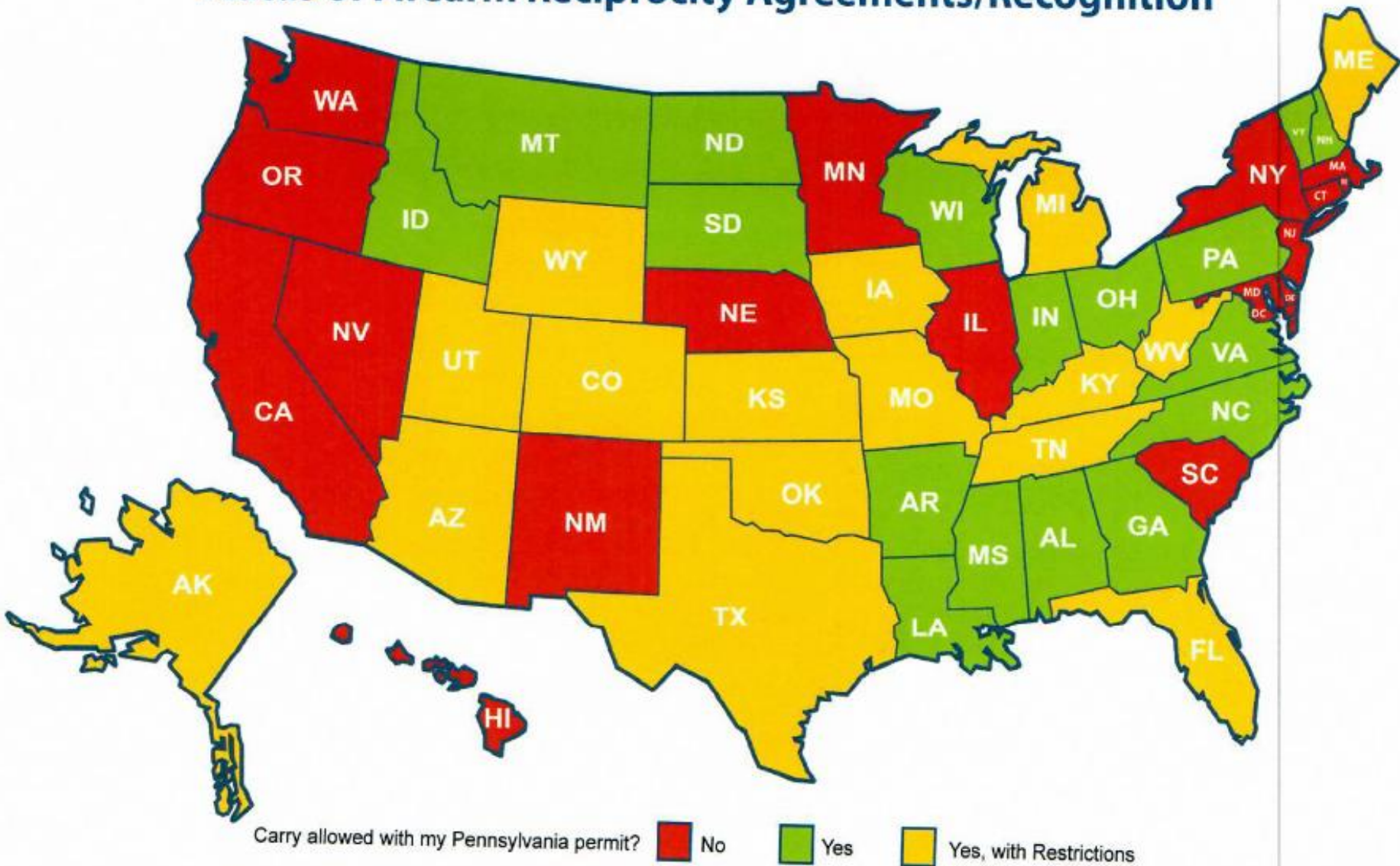
